## Kathy Jones Memorial Walk Path Project Update

Kathy Jones, a prominent member of the Fair Oaks community passed away on October 17, 2013. Kathy led a life committed to the betterment of the community through the many organizations, events, and activities in which she participated. Kathy walked Phoenix Park daily and in 2012 Kathy ran for the Fair Oaks Chamber's Honorary Mayor and won. Her campaign project was fund raising to extend the walk paths at Phoenix Park. In 2013 the Fair Oaks Recreation and Park District's Board of Directors voted to name all of the walk paths at Phoenix Park the Kathy Jones Memorial Walk Path.

The Fair Oaks Foundation for Leisure and the Arts donated \$10,000 to the project, along with the Rotary Club of Fair Oaks who also donated \$10,000 and numerous volunteer hours to the project. **In 2013 the District renovated the upstairs kitchen with plans to renovate the lower level kitchen in 2014.**




