If you need immediate law enforcement assistance or to report illegal activity at any of our parks, please call the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department at 874-5115.

DISTRICT BOARD MEETINGS

The Board of Directors of the Fair Oaks Recreation and Park District meets on the third Wednesday of each month. Meetings are held at the Old Fair Oaks Library Building, 4200 Temescal St., beginning at 6:00 pm. The public is welcome to attend. Please contact the District office prior to attending a meeting to confirm the date and time, as Board meeting dates and times are subject to change.




Children enrolled in the Fair Oaks Preschool Program will become exposed to numbers, letters, and shapes and more importantly they will learn how to socialize, get along with other children, share and contribute to circle time. The children will learn how to raise their hands, share the teacher's attention and separate from Mommy or Daddy. Children who attend preschool typically make an easier transition into kindergarten.


