





Children enrolled in the Fair Oaks Preschool Program will become exposed to numbers, letters, and shapes and more importantly they will learn how to socialize, get along with other children, share and contribute to circle time. The children will learn how to raise their hands, share the teacher's attention and separate from Mommy or Daddy. Children who attend preschool typically make an easier transition into kindergarten.

PROGRAM OPTIONS/SESSIONS/FEEES

Mon, Wed & Fri • 9am - 12pm • \$185 (\$180 res) per 4wk session

Mon, Wed & Fri • 12:45 - 3:30pm • \$185 (\$180 res) per 4wk session

The four and five year old classes are based upon a nine-month curriculum designed to prepare a child for elementary school. Cooperation and sharing are emphasized in games, music and movement, arts and crafts, academics and supervised free play throughout the year

Tue/Thu • 9am -12pm • \$135 (\$130 res) per 4wk session

This recreation-oriented program is a good introduction to group activities. Children will experience simple arts and crafts, show and tell, circle time, organized games and supervised free play.

Yearly, nonrefundable, registration fee of \$75 due at time of registration. Children currently enrolled in the program have priority to re-enroll.





LARGE EVENT SITES

- The Community Clubhouse is separated into three different spaces. The largest of the spaces is the Clubhouse Auditorium with a capacity of 182 seated and 390 standing. 
